Change in the Pastor's Terms of Call

The meeting was turned over to Rick Lambert, Elder for Administration/Personnel Team.

The Bender family was excused from the meeting for the discussion on the changes in the Pastor's Terms of Call.

2024 Year-end Summary for Program Director

My responsibilities as Program Director (22 hrs./ week):

- * Nursery Nursery staffing has been volunteer only, as we have no consistent attendance. The Christian Education team will cover the nursery with 2 adults who have been background checked / child protection trained, if children come to worship. There are several of us on the CE team that qualify and are willing. I have kept up with the volunteer screenings and have coordinated nurseries as needed.
- * MMO Director Responsibilities include registration, filling spots that become vacant throughout the year, arranging subs, planning lessons, getting snacks, and collecting tuition. (My position as MMO teacher is a separate job, 4 hrs. per week).
- * Children's Worship—When we have children (K-4th grade) in worship who would like to participate in Children's Worship, I work with CE volunteers to offer a children's church lesson We have prepared lessons in the craft closet that volunteers can use when needed. I am also working to maintain supplies in the worship bags, which children can use in the sanctuary, as well as a selection of books for them to choose from, if they would like. This year I replaced the worship bag "tree" with a sturdier one and added some new items to the bags.
- * CE Kits We provide Christian Education kits quarterly, for families to learn about the Bible together at home. I adapt a unit of curriculum from the *Growing in God's Love* series (published by the PCUSA). Each family receives a Story Bible, and each unit covers 4-6 stories from the Story Bible, inviting families to read, discuss, and then engage in activities and crafts to teach more about that story or theme. We send home a unit approximately every 3 months, and distribute 8 kits at a time, reaching about 14 children. Several in our congregation are using these with their children or grandchildren, as well as a couple of the MMO moms and a family who joined the program after VBS. The CE team packs and distributes these kits.
- * Adult Education This year, I have continued as some of the "tech help" with adult education, including our adult Sunday School classes, Advent / Lenten Bible study and Women's Bible study. This hybrid work has been greatly enhanced by the "OWL" camera / mic, but I have limitations in my knowledge of how best to use it and would love to have a few alternate folks trained to use it. I have taught sessions of the Lenten series, adult Sunday School sessions, and am co-teaching "Be the Bridge" small group with Lasenia Jones.
- * Small Groups I was able to be involved again this year with choosing Small Group studies, helping to advertise and coordinate sign-ups and book orders, as well as to be part of Be the Bridge.
- * Youth Group I plan, along with the kids, programs for our youth to meet 2x per month. We rotate between mission projects, fellowship time, and a book study of Rachel Held Evans' *Inspired*, this year. We have done several mission-focused activities this year, including hosting activities at "Trunk or Tr'Easter" and the Pumpkin Patch, and shopping for Angel Tree and senior gift bags this Christmas. I also work with the recycled ink program, which helps us to pay for youth trips and other unbudgeted expenses.
- * VBS –My responsibilities with VBS continue to include making arrangements with Bethelwoods, maintaining registrations, recruiting, and scheduling volunteers to help with food, ordering t-shirts, etc. In 2024, Faith folks wrapped around the VBS counselors, to provide more adult assistance, as well as to teach the kids about some of our ministries. I worked with the CE team to plan and implement this change.
- * **Children's Ministry** I was happy to be part of some outreach to children and families in our community, including "Trunk or Tr'Easter," the kids' day at the Pumpkin Patch, and the Advent worship.

- * Retreat team I have loved meeting with an enthusiastic group of planners as we look toward a Faith retreat in Sept '25. This group has surveyed the congregation for interest, visited Bethelwoods for a tour, and begun to plan the program and structure for a fun retreat!
- * **People Growth Team** I met with the People Growth Committee and have helped to do some social media advertising
- * Christian Education Team I also met with the CE committee for most of the above work. They are great at generating ideas and creating programs, and I am blessed to work with them.
- * Communications Team I met with the new Communications team this year. I continue to post on social media 3x per week and help with the newsletter.

In addition to meeting with these committees, I have offered support for Zoom needs that they have had and have helped with adding events to the church calendar.

- * Montreat Women's Connection Twelve women from Faith (plus 2 from other congregations) were able to participate in the Women's Connection in August. I helped coordinate registration, transportation, housing, and food. I have also been working with the SC Inn staff (and William Black staff post-hurricane) to make sure that we are registered for the 2025 conference.
- * Service to the Larger Church Part of the gift of the Presbyterian Church is that we are connectional and lean on each other from time to time. I meet with the educators of Providence Presbytery throughout the school year, which gives me a great group of colleagues to bounce ideas off of and gain new ideas and insights on how to improve our program. I also spend some of my time contributing to the presbytery, by serving on the Community of Faith (education team) of the presbytery. This team planned the 2024 Mental Health First Aid workshop.
- * Continuing Education I was thankful to be able to attend the 2024 Association of Partners in Christian Education (APCE) meeting in St Louis. Especially in these days when ministry is changing rapidly, it is a blessing to be connected to other educators in the PCUSA and other partner denominations.

Administration and Personnel

2024 was a very busy year for the Administration and Personnel team with several of our activities devoted to bringing our programs from those used for a small church to those needed for a larger church. It is a great feeling to have a church that is growing as ours is.

In the area of personnel management, we had no written personnel policies, but we relied on an informal approach to communicate what we provided to our employees. This year we developed personnel policies for employment, vacations, sick days, inclement weather, and other topics. We documented these policies in the church's first Personnel Policy manual which has been approved by the Session and is now in effect. Additionally, we created Faith's Human Resources Management Team to focus on HR issues, ensure compliance with State and Federal employment regulations, and update our Policies as needed.

As our church grows, the administrative requirements also grow. Recognizing our increasing workload, we recommended the addition of an Administrative Manager to staff. Upon Session approval, we posted the position and have conducted several interviews with prospective candidates. We expect the position to be filled in January 2025.

Insurance also required our attention during the year, with 2024 being a year of increasing cost due to significant losses to the insurance industry. We were able to obtain a new policy at the most reasonable cost from our existing insurance company. We will be faced with an increased cost for Pastor David's benefit package from PC(USA) due to increasing cost in the health care area. Finally, our church was without Workman's Compensation insurance which put us at risk if an employee or contractor was injured on our property. We were able to obtain an appropriate policy through our property insurer.

We have continued to work on the implementation of Realm, a software system developed by ACS Technologies, the creator of our financial management software. Realm has several very good features for planning meetings and events, communicating with committee members, tracking prospects, and maintaining records of our members. However, it requires several hours of training to use the system properly.

In 2024 we have cleaned up member database in Realm and are using the system to track church attendance and provide us with member and prospective member information. As part of this process, we reinstituted the use of attendance pads in our church services. We have also begun providing training to some committees to schedule meetings and communicate with their team members.

We believe that the addition of the Administrative Manager will help us in Realm implementation since it will provide a single point of contact for questions on Realm usage. So, our Realm implementation will continue in 2025.

The church's technology also needed to be reviewed since we have instituted streaming of our services, are making use of Zoom technology for remote meetings, and we are expanding our building, which requires additional capabilities in the new section. To meet these growing needs, we have instituted a Technology Management Team with members of the Administration-Personnel Committee, the Communications Committee, and the Audio-Visual Team. The Technology Management Team will be utilizing an outside company to help us evaluate what technology we have and develop a plan for maintaining and improving our technology in the future.

We also undertook a review and update of the church's Operations Manual. Since the Operations Manual documents our policies and procedures, it requires constant review to ensure that everything is current. In 2024 we conducted a more detailed review and updated several areas in the manual.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

January 2024

The B&G team worked with the Worship team to re-set the sanctuary after the Christmas season. A Girl Scout event was held in our sanctuary on January 6, requiring a set-up for the event and then a re-set. New shelving units were built and placed in the front-right storage area. On January 10, an expert began a scan of the Old Six Mile Cemetery looking for unmarked grave sites.

February 2024

The team discussed logistics required to serve as a polling place for upcoming elections. A discussion took place regarding purchasing two new Christmas trees for the sanctuary that would be easier to put up each year and easier to store. Discussions were initiated about better use of the bulletin board space across from the restrooms in the sanctuary building; the Communications said they would take the lead on that item. On May 2, the congregation was invited and encouraged to help clean up the church grounds. Discussions on replacing the digital projector and screen with a monitor continued. Discussions began about replacing the 4 picnic tables and about better ideas for the tents during the Pumpkin Patch.

March-May 2024

The team took down and then re-set the sanctuary for Holy Week events. Clean-up behind the office building continued. There was a discussion of the impact of the new drainage for our building extension and its potential impact on some of our plant life began. We started working with the Communication Team on how to better use our bulletin board area. Discussions continued on the possibility of replacing our picnic tables. A report was presented outlining likely buildings and grounds upkeep and replacement expenditures for the next 15 years.

June 2024

Materials were assembled for stripping and painting the office building door. The team facilitated the clean-up behind the office building. The team hosted the June 11, 2024, primary polling with light turnout. Routine appointments were scheduled for air conditioner maintenance, pest control and landscaping. The Old Six Mile cemetery received the gift of a rebuilt and donated lawnmower. The B&G cemetery team provided decorations for Memorial Day.

July 2024

This month had a few maintenance projects. We reported on expenditures for carpet cleaning; made preparations for stripping and painting the office door once the humidity dissipated a bit; and facilitated a big clean-up behind the church office building. We provided updates on various maintenance schedules—air conditioning, pest control, mowing. We supported the Women's Bible Study brunch by setting up and taking down tables and chairs. We presented a proposed Information Technology Policy for the ministry teams to review.

August-September 2024

The B&G team planned and accomplished the running of cable underneath the floor in the office building, which was connected to the administrative computer, the Owl, and the television monitor. We worked with Komfort Air to diagnose air conditioning issues; updated carpet cleaning and chair cleaning project plans; and assisted with a memorial service. Much time was dedicated to discussion of the building expansion.

October-November 2024

A data cable was installed beneath the floor in the office building, with a floor box underneath the tables. We approved a facility use request from folks at Our Lady of Grace Catholic Church to utilize space in our sanctuary building for youth group events two Sunday evenings per month from September through May. The team supported a funeral on October 11 and the Stewardship Luncheon on October 13 by setting and re-setting the sanctuary. We supported the pumpkin patch ministry; prepared the sanctuary for Election Day voting; and helped clean the Old Six Mile Cemetery following the hurricane.

December 2024

The team led support in the transformation of the buildings for the Advent and Christmas seasons. More storage units were installed in the left closet in the sanctuary. Discussions took place on how we will support a Girl Scouts Cookie Sale training event on January 4, 2025. We supported other teams by setting and re-setting the sanctuary for Candlelight Christmas and the Women's Bible Study brunch. We also started pursuing various projects to keep up our grounds, and became involved with other ministry teams regarding construction of a new playground.

Christian Education (CE) Annual Report, 2024

The CE Team worked hard this year to provide a variety of educational opportunities for the members and friends of Faith Church. The members of the Team for 2024 were: Edye Bender, Pinky Bender, Lois Briggs, Amy Chapman, Barbara Choate, Marsha Fairbanks, Sandy Knight, Stephanie Lambert, Kathy McGovern, Susan Moore, Ann Marie Simm, and Daune Teague. The faithful work of these women is greatly appreciated!

Ongoing Opportunities at Faith in 2024

- *Women's Bible Study: An energetic group of women meet every second Monday of the month at 11:00 AM in the church office. The Rev. Dr. Pinky Bender ably leads this class. This year the study was on the book of Mark. In the months of July and December, the group enjoys a delicious brunch and a time of fellowship.
- *Adult Sunday School Class: This group meets every Sunday at 9:00 AM in the church office. Pastor David's questions on the back of the bulletin are used to start a lively discussion on the previous week's sermon. During Advent, a DVD series called The Journey by Adam Hamilton was used to stimulate our discussions.
- ***Youth Group:** Edye Bender leads this small but dedicated group of high schoolers in a variety of service, study, and social opportunities. This year the group has assisted with the Blessing of the Animals, Angel Tree gifts, Senior Gift Bags, Christmas caroling, Trunk or Tr'EASTER, and Pumpkin Patch Family Day.
- *Children's Ministry: We continue to distribute *Growing in God's Love* kits to children grades K-4 associated with our church for family faith development. Usually 9-11 kits are distributed quarterly. In addition, members of the CE team are prepared to teach Children's Church for young children who come to worship and to provide Nursery Care for babies or toddlers on Easter, Christmas eve, and any other Sunday when this service is needed.
- *Mother's Morning Out: Edye Bender and Susan Moore do a great job of teaching this weekly program for 2 and 3-year-olds. Eight energetic little ones come for a half-day program each Wednesday morning during the school year.
- *Church Library: The Church Library, under the supervision of MJ Carr, continues to provide interesting reading material for our congregation. A cart was placed in the gathering hall this year to make the books more visible and accessible.

Short Term Opportunities at Faith in 2024

- *Lenten Bible Study: A group met for six weeks during Lent to study the book Witnesses at the Cross by Amy-Jill Levine. Average attendance was 30, both in person and on Zoom.
- *Trunk or Tr'EASTER: This family event was held on March 17, 2024, with a large number of children and their families from the community coming to Faith to enjoy games, crafts, treats, bouncy houses, the Easter story, and a prayer center, This event was planned with the help of the People Growth Team and many Faith volunteers.
- *Pizza Party for MMO: CE Team members assisted with the end-of-year Pizza Party.
- *Vacation Bible School: During the week of June 17-21, Faith hosted 44+ children for VBS. Six counselors from Bethelwoods Camp led the school, with many Faith members assisting with registration, snacks, lunch, introducing several of our Mission projects, and serving as aides for each age group.
- *Women's Connection at Montreat: Fifteen women from Faith attended this annual retreat in the mountains of Western NC in August for inspiration and fellowship.
- *Small Groups: In our third year of offering Small Groups, we had 67 people sign up to participate. Eight groups are currently meeting once a month in homes, studying a variety of topics. These groups enrich us in Bible knowledge, spiritual growth, and fellowship with other members of Faith.
- *Advent Devotions: Three Advent daily devotionals were made available to the congregation online and one devotional in printed form.

2024 Communications Ministry Annual Team Report

The Communications Ministry team was formed in 2024 with responsibility for developing and executing a strategy for effective communication among and between the church, the congregation, and the community at large. This new role was crucial in ensuring that communication within the church is clear, consistent, and aligned with the church's goals and values. The team developed a Communication Ministry Ecosystem which we executed throughout 2024. (Thanks to Edye for doing the graphic).



The team worked with other ministry teams on projects such as REALM. This church communication software was first introduced to small groups starting with Session members and their respective groups. They were trained to use its features, allowing the ministry teams to set up events and track attendance. We also implemented a CHECK-IN to Sunday worship using REALM CONNECT, to facilitate church attendance. In addition, we are now

recording attendance using REALM. The bulletin board was updated with photos that identified the administrative staff, session, and new members.

The team led by Edye Bender and Rick Lambert continued to use social media's Facebook, Instagram, and the World Wide Web to inform, and to distribute outreach materials to the members of Faith Presbyterian Church and the community at large. Faith This Week, a weekly newsletter containing inspirational articles from Pastor David, goes out to the congregation. It keeps the congregation informed on all church events and activities.

A subcommittee that focused on the church's annual Stewardship Campaign was formed to communicate with the congregation the financial needs and ministry opportunities of the church. The campaign not only met the financial goal but exceeded it.

We are committed to further enhancing the digital sign at the front of the church so that it can be read from both directions while driving on HWY 521. We will also work to achieve full implementation of the REALM communication software, and to guarantee uninterrupted network communication.

- The Card Ministry sent out approximately 107 greeting cards to bring a touch of kindness and well wishes to so many of our congregation and homebound members. We also send expressions of sympathy and for special occasions as well. Additionally, 15 cards were sent out for Thanksgiving. The card making workshop also provides us with several cards each month.
- **Prayer Chain Ministry**-Under the leadership of Jill Bikowski, members can request urgent and immediate prayers that cannot wait until the Sunday prayers.
- Prayer Shawl Ministry-Our several faithful crafters (knitters and crocheters) have made sure
 that we always have a good supply of shawls, ready to be presented when needed. 62 prayer
 shawls and 4 fleece blankets for children were presented in 2024 to Faith members and others
 who were experiencing loss of close family members or friends, life altering illness, surgery, or
 difficult circumstances. All shawls and blankets were blessed by Pastor David at various times
 throughout the year.

Knitted or crocheted pocket prayer shawls are always available at the Church. These were also included in Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes, Senior Gift Bags, and the New Visitor Gift Bag.

A number of VBS attendees learned to knit with instructor Jessica.

The 4th Annual Faith Knitting Challenge was enormously successful. An overwhelming 439 beautiful knitted and crocheted hats of all sizes were blessed by Pastor David and presented to the United Way in Lancaster for distribution by them to needy individuals in Lancaster County. We are so very grateful to all who participated in this generous and loving ministry.

Because of generous financial donations, we have been able to keep our crafters well supplied with yarn. In addition, several large donations of yarn were made to the Ministry this year. We are truly grateful!

Besides being presented locally, shawls (large and small) have made their way all over the United States and to at least 7 foreign countries.

The Prayer Shawl Team welcomed several new crafters this year. As this important ministry continues to grow and flourish, additional crafters are welcome and needed.

The Finance Committee wants to thank the congregation for their continued support of Faith Presbyterian Church (FPC) with their time, talents, and treasurers. Contributions exceeded the budget for 2024. Expenses in 2024 were underbudget. The following are some major financial accomplishments for 2024:

- 1. FPC was able to make major contributions to the contingency fund. The contingency fund is used to cover major upgrades and repairs to the church's infrastructure. Having the contingency funds allows the church to deal with unexpected repairs without having to redirect funds in the current year's budget.
- 2. FPC was able to secure a mortgage to fund the construction of the 1.3-million-dollar Ministry Center. Key to obtaining the mortgage and being able to build a 1.3-million-dollar structure was the success of the current capital campaign for the construction of the Ministry Center.
- 3. The mortgage on the worship center was paid off by a generous member of the congregation. By having the mortgage on the worship center paid off the congregation can concentrate on paying down the mortgage on the Ministry Center.
- 4. The stewardship campaign was very successful. The generous pledges for 2025 exceed the campaign goal. The success of the campaign allowed for a balanced budget for 2025 to be created. Generating a balanced budget could have been a challenge because of the increased costs of operating the Ministry Center and overall increased cost of operating FPC.
- 5. Finance Committee reported the financial results to Session every month.

Postcards: Beginning in March over 200 postcards were mailed out to newcomers in the area and placed in the paper tubes of new residents of Sun City. Data Axle was our source for the mailing list. Not receiving adequate results from the mailings, we decided to stop after three months.

Trunk or Tr'Easter: In early March we participated in the planning and carrying out of the very successful Trunk or Tr'Easter event.

Life's Recovery: The 12-Step Christian Ministry which Marvin started in October of 2023 has continued throughout 2024 with good participation.

Sweet Little Symphonies: A music class for babies and toddlers in the community was started in August 2024 and is continuing. Jennifer Gouvatsos and Kim Psinakis approached David Bender and then our People Growth team about offering this program on Saturday mornings in the church office. Session approved and the program began.

Pumpkin Patch: Preparation for the Pumpkin Patch begins early in January with the selection of a hopeful delivery date for the pumpkins. Christine Affonso leads the Pumpkin Parch endeavor. Her organizational skills and attention to detail keep the yearlong plans on track. Communion Responsibilities:

- a. The sacrament of the Lord's Supper continued to be celebrated the first Sunday of each month, as well as Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve. A rotating schedule of elder teams who serve communion with Pastor David was published in December for 2025.
- b. Members of the Worship Team (Pinky Bender, Judy and Rod Boyes, and Ann Mary Northrup) prepared the elements and often served to clean up with a rotating group of team members.
- c. Chancel linen: The paraments were changed by the team according to the liturgical calendar. Pastor David changed the banners to reflect the same special times.

Live streaming and Recording:

a. Jack Haubach continued to coordinate all AV work including the creation of the weekly PowerPoint for our worship services. At times, Bob Bertolini. Ken Edmonds, Larry Handeland, Rich Briggs, and Bonnie Haubach assisted Jack in the booth.

b. On Saturdays, Bob Bertolini and Jan Cullen served to review PowerPoint, as did Shirley Sweeny, Christine Affonso, and Linda Gibson.

Worship Volunteers:

- a. Ushers and Greeters. Schedules of volunteers were prepared and published quarterly.
- b. Scripture Readers. Except for the first Sunday of the month when Pastor David and Carol Edmonds present the scripture passages, volunteers read Scripture Lessons for the Sunday worship services as well as readings during Lent and Advent. A list of volunteers is prepared and published on a quarterly basis.

Sanctuary - Worship Services:

- a. Janet Bershers and Krysia McCurdy continued to co-chair the Decorations committee, responsible for decorations for the gathering hall and sanctuary for each season.
- b. The Building and Grounds Team also helped prepare the church for special seasons, including draping the Columbarium cross in purple for Lent and white in time for the Easter services.
- c. Chancel Flowers: Janet and Krysia continued to be responsible for the Flower Chart sign-up book.
- d. Music: Faith is fortunate to have gifted musicians. Carol Edmonds is our pianist and music worship leader, and Baha Lee is the director of the choir and handbell ringers. Ken Edmonds often performs at Sunday Services and he and Carol provided special music performances, with invited guests, at various times during the year. Judy Brown provided piano music in Carol's absence, and Bette Acker played flute accompaniments this past fall.
- e. Bulletins: The bulletins were prepared by Pastor David with a group of volunteers, led by Jan Sellards, Christine Affonso, Lasenia Jones and Kathy Bjorklund, proofreading, printing, and folding. Jan Sellards chaired an effort to document the entire Bulletin Preparation Process. The Document was approved by the Worship Team and accepted by Session as part of the Procedures Manual
- f. Pastor David was on Sabbatical during portions of April, May, and June. During this time, Rev. Colin Winchester, Rev. Pinky Bender, and Rev. Edgar McCall filled the Pulpit.

Welcome Table:

Jan Sellards continued to staff this table. First time visitors were presented a loaf of bread baked by Jan, Janet Bershers, and other Faith volunteers. Visitors were encouraged to fill in their information on a yellow form. Pastor David was given the information which was processed for the church records. A Faith postcard was also promptly sent to the visitor's home.

Chrismon Ministry:

- a. This team, under the leadership of Sandy Horton and Jo-Ann Hitzemann, worked steadily all year to create beautiful Chrismons. Chrismons were given to honor joyous events in the lives of members of our Faith family and to spread comfort to those with serious illnesses. Chrismons were also given to new church members. In November, a Chrismon Workshop was open to all Faith members for a cost of \$10, which included lunch.
- b. This group also provided the message on the first Sunday in Advent worship service, Dec. 1. The program consisted of presentations on the history of Chrismons, how Faith got involved, current activities and several testimonies on the meaning of Chrismons.

Lenten and Advent Traditions:

- a. The Lenten practice takes its cue from the Advent wreath only rather than lighting a candle weekly, the Lenten practice extinguishes a candle weekly. The dimming of the light during Lent reminds people that this 40-day journey is leading to the cross of Good Friday. The Worship Team initiated this practice and arranged seven votive candles on the edge of the communion table. On the first Sunday of Lent, all seven candles were lit before worship began. After a structured reading each week, a candle was extinguished until the last candle was put out at the end of Holy Week. On Easter Sunday, all candles were lit again to signify that Christ is alive and living among us.
- b. Pinky, Jan Sellards and Jack Haubach were coordinators of A Day of Prayer held on Ash Wednesday. It was a very meaningful time for all attendees.
- c. Tenebrae Service: After a simple soup supper (planned in coordination with the Fellowship Team), the Lord's Supper was celebrated. We then experienced the beautiful Tenebrae (shadow) service. Worship Team members participated in the readings from Matthew, as the room gradually darkened. Following the final hymn, worshipers were invited to depart in silence.
- d. Advent practice is like Lenten practice. During the first 4 Sundays of Advent, plus Christmas Eve, Scripture is read, and candle(s) are lit on the Advent Wreath.
